Information During the Jamboree

If you have a question or run into a challenge while you are at Jamboree Denmark 2026, help is never far away. Whatever your question, you are always welcome at one of the jamboree's information tents. You will find one in each subcamp, as well as the jamboree's Information Centre at Spejdertorvet (the jamboree main square)

Opening hours

Subcamp Information Tents: 8.00 AM - 20.00 PM

Information Centre: 6.30 AM - 10.30 PM

Here you can hand in lost and found items, ask questions about activities or the activity badge, and get help with any other questions or challenges, big or small. In the subcamps, medicine that needs refrigeration is also stored, while at the Information Centre you can get help with Skejser.

The phone line is open from 6.30 AM - 10.30 PM during the jamboree.



Jamboree App

Jamboree Denmark 2026 offers nine days packed with activities, experiences and community. To make it easier to find your way around, we are launching an app for the jamboree that brings together the most important information in one place.

The purpose of the app is not to draw attention away from the jamboree but, on the contrary, to support being present and to strengthen the community. When you can quickly find answers to practical matters, there is more time and headspace to focus on what is happening around you. We therefore also encourage you as a leader to talk with your group about how you will use your mobile phones during the jamboree, so that they become a useful tool rather than a distraction.

In the app you will find:

- Programme of the jamboree's activities and events
- Map of the jamboree site so you can easily find your way
- Practical information desk such as opening hours, points of interest, contact details and cookbook

The app is an optional way to keep the most important information desk in your pocket, but it is not necessary in order to enjoy the jamboree.

To make it as easy as possible for guides and scouts with parental controls on their phones, the app does not need to be downloaded from the App Store or Google Play. Instead, it can be accessed directly in the phone's browser and saved to the home screen for easy access. We have designed it with children in mind, so data collection is kept to a minimum and is only stored locally on each person's phone.

We are currently testing the app with guide and scout groups and expect to launch it at the beginning of summer 2026, so you can get familiar with it before the jamboree begins on the 18th of July.

Skejser

To keep the jamboree participants as safe as possible, all participants will receive a wristband with a chip that can be used for payments. This solution is what we call "Skejser". This means we do not use cash at the jamboree.

Shops, kiosks and stalls at Jamboree Denmark 2026 also accept Visa/Dankort, Visa, MasterCard, Apple Pay, Google Pay and American Express. If you have a payment card, it is the easiest solution for you and the most economical for the jamboree if you use your card. So please use your card – and if you do not have a card, then use Skejser.

Participants who do not have a payment card can use the Skejser wristband to pay. Please note that you can only pay with your Skejser wristband in stalls and shops on the jamboree site, not in shops or at activities outside the jamboree.



You can add money to the wristband ("top it up") at <https://skejser.dk/en>. Several people can top up the wristband, for example both parents and grandparents may insert funds on the same wristband.

If the wristband is not on your arm, you cannot use it at points of sale unless it is attached to your ID card (for example for volunteer kitchen and healthcare staff).

Older or younger than 18 years of age

The wristbands are different colours. Participants under 18 years of age will have a dark green wristband, participants over 18 years of age will have a light green wristband.

If you turn 18 during the jamboree, you can exchange your wristband in the Skejser Info Tent at Spedejrtorvet (the jamboree main square) upon presentation of valid identification.

In some areas, the wristband will also be used for access control. The light green wristband also serves as your admission ticket to the jamboree's adults only area.

Skejser

Receiving Skejser Wristbands, Jamboree Badges and Parking Permits

Jamboree Denmark 2026 has already sent a package with Skejser wristbands, jamboree badges and parking permits to all groups in Denmark and to Danish groups abroad. Each group is responsible for distributing the contents to its own participants.

From 18th of July, you can contact your subcamp information tent or the Information Centre at Spejdertorvet if you have received the wrong amount of jamboree badges and/or Skejser wristbands. Here the missing badges or wristbands will be handed out.

Who will not be sent Skejser Wristbands, etc.?

All volunteers and international groups will not be sent Skejser wristbands, jamboree badges and parking permits in advance, but must instead contact the Information Tent in the subcamp on arrival.

Activating Your Skejser Account

Using Skejser at the jamboree requires a little preparation from the group and from parents. International participants can create their Skejser account in advance from home. However, the skejser wristband can only be linked to the account once they have received the physical wristband. This is handled through the subcamp information tent.

Closing Your Skejser Account

Your Skejser account will be closed after the jamboree. If there is any money left in the account, you can choose between the following options:

- Donate the remaining balance to Jamboree Denmark 2026 by visiting <https://skejser.dk/en> no later than August 6th 2026.
- Have the remaining balance automatically refunded a few weeks after the jamboree. The remaining balance will be returned to the card most recently used for payment.

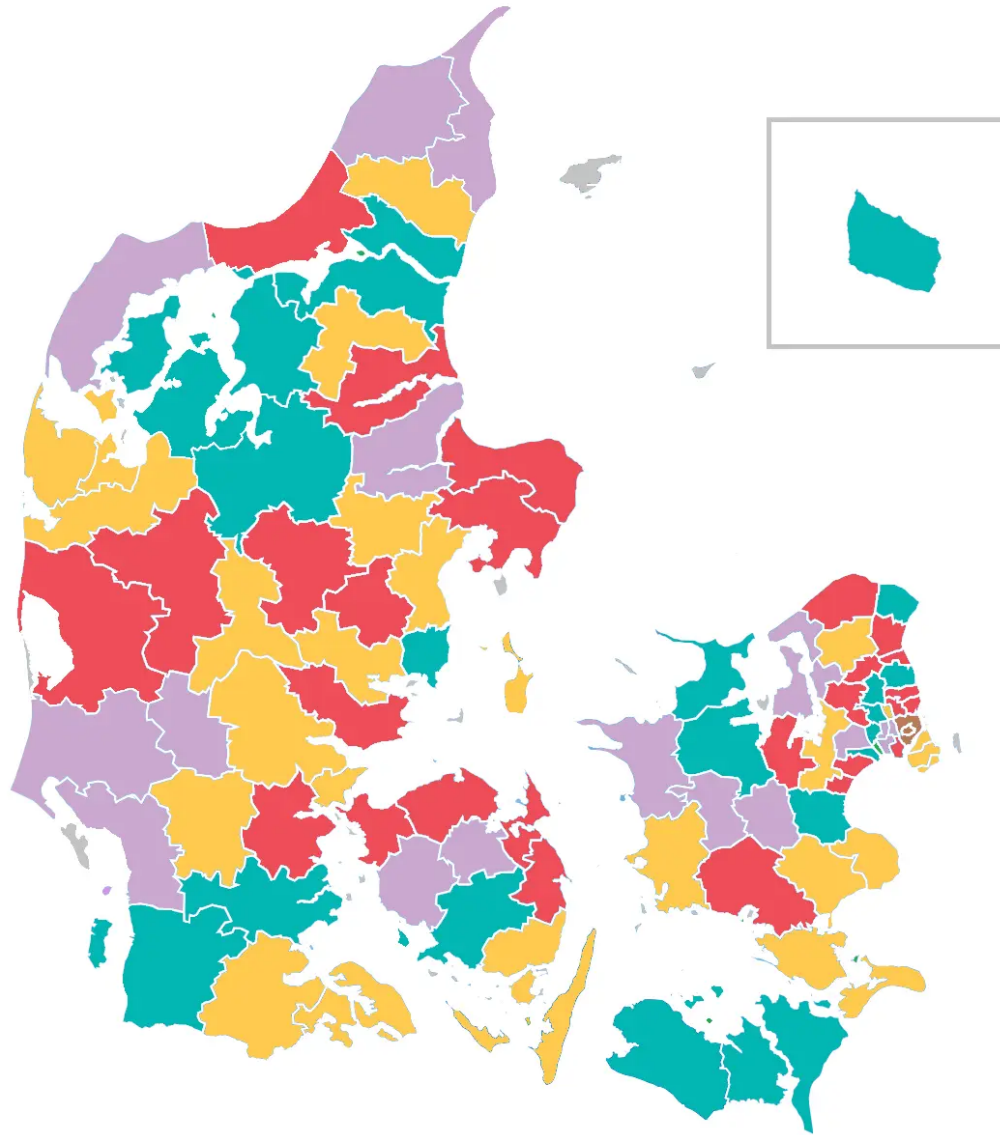

Check-in

Check-in for Danish and international groups

Upon arrival at the jamboree, an adult representative from the group must check the entire group into the subcamp where they will be staying. Check-in takes place in the information tent on the subcamp square in the relevant subcamp. At check-in, the group representative must confirm all participants and any changes to the list of participants.

It is important that the correct names appear on the group registration at check-in. Any changes to the group registration that result in an additional participation fee must be paid immediately.

It is therefore not possible to check in to the jamboree if the group has any outstanding payments to the jamboree.

Check-in for Danish and international volunteers

All ISTs and volunteers must check in upon arrival at the jamboree. Upon arrival, you will be given a canteen wristband, which is required when eating in one of the jamboree's volunteer canteens.

Check-in for ISTs and volunteers takes place at the following times and locations:

27/6 - 10/7: Check-in at the dining tent at Tranemosevej 2. Meals are also served here during this period.

11/7 - 17/7: Check-in at the information tent in subcamp Skoven (the forest), where the canteen is also open during this period.

15/7 - 17/7: The canteen in subcamp Landet (the countryside) is also open.

18/7 - 26/7: Check-in at the information tent in the subcamp where the volunteer will be staying. The canteens in all four subcamps are open.

SHOWERS and charging

Showers at the jamboree

There will be an opportunity to take a shower at the jamboree. Participants must pay to take a shower, while volunteers do not pay for showers. Payment is made at the shower trailer with the Skejser wristband. Volunteers must use their volunteer wristband as an admission ticket.

The price is 20 DKK per shower.

Charging your group's electronic devices

It is possible to charge electronic devices in all four subcamps, where one charging container will be set up in each subcamp. Here the group can return a box with the items that need charging and collect the box the next morning. The box must have a cable with a 230V plug (plug type C) so that it can be plugged directly into a socket in the container. Remember to write the group's name on the box.

Opening hours

Charging containers are open every day 7.00 AM - 9.00 AM and 4.00 PM - 7.00 PM.

Charging stations at the jamboree

In addition, eight charging stations with power banks will be set up around the jamboree, offering various charging options for a fee. The location of the machines will appear on the jamboree map in the jamboree app.

In the webshop, you can buy a subscription that gives you two hours of charging (power bank) every day throughout the entire jamboree for a total of 200 DKK. In addition, you can purchase 30 minutes of charging from a power bank using a QR code displayed on the machine. It costs 25 DKK. The power bank can be returned to any machine when the time has expired. If you do not return the power bank on time, an additional 25 DKK per per half hour. However, a maximum of 100 DKK per day. If the power bank is not returned to a machine at all, an additional fee of 175 DKK will be charged. If there is no free space in a machine when you return it, contact the company, which will ensure that you are not charged a fee. The company's contact details are written on the machines.

Note. It is not possible to charge your own power banks in the machines. You can charge these in the group's box in the charging containers, as described above.

Webshop

Order a package delivered to Jamboree Denmark 2026 with a single click and treat someone you care about at Jamboree Denmark 2026.

Through our webshop <https://spejderpost.dk/en> you can order packages with personal greetings, which will be handed over directly at the jamboree.

<https://spejderpost.dk/en> is set up like any other webshop. Here you can fill your basket with sweets, snacks and cakes for birthdays and celebrations. You then choose the desired delivery date and write a personal greeting. Then, we will make sure it reaches the recipient.

The package will be delivered to the Information Tent in the subcamp where the group is staying. The group can then collect the packages there. The webshop will be open, so packages can be delivered at the jamboree from the first day of the jamboree at 18th of July through to 25th of July 2026.

The times in the daily programme are only an approximate guide. You should therefore always make sure to check, in particular, activity times and travel time to activities. For the Activity Centre West and for activities outside the jamboree, there are special arrangements concerning lunch. The same applies in relation to dinner for overnight activities. Further details will follow.

Please note that the daily programme may be subject to change.

FOOD SUPPLIES

Food Supplies Distribution

In each subcamp, there is a food supplies distribution point on the subcamp square. The food supplies distribution is an "open" distribution point, where guides and scouts can freely come and collect the basic items they need. The basic products available are listed in the assortment list below. To avoid food waste, we ask that you only collect the items you need for each meal. It is not possible to return items to the food supplies distribution point.

Opening hours are very generous, as the goods are better stored at the food supplies distribution point until they are needed. This applies particularly to chilled goods, but other products also spoil more easily once they have been taken out into the jamboree.

So take what you need, but no more!

Special items for the evening meals are distributed according to the number of guides and scouts in the group on a given day. Items are handed out group by group, as staff at the distribution point scan a registered jamboree wristband. This shows which evening meal the group has chosen and which quantities of the various items the group will need, including special items related to allergies and dietary considerations.

For the wristband to work at the food supplies distribution point, it must be registered on the group's registration page by the person responsible for registration. We recommend that all leader wristbands are entered into the system before the jamboree. It is optional whether guide and scout wristbands are registered.

Allergies and Dietary Considerations

Basic products for people with allergies and dietary considerations are also distributed by the staff at the food supplies distribution point. This is done to ensure that these items go to those who really need them. It is important that all groups have registered allergies and dietary considerations correctly, otherwise we cannot guarantee the necessary quantities of items for these participants.

Cool Packs

Two freezer cabinets have been set up at the food supplies distribution points, where groups can freeze their own cool packs. Cool packs are handed in and collected during the distribution opening hours. The food supplies distribution points are not responsible for the freezer cabinets, so it is up to the groups themselves to agree how to make the system work. We recommend storing cool packs in a sealed bag clearly marked with the group's name.

Open activities

What are 'open activities', and what can you look forward to experiencing during them?

Open activities are all the things you can do spontaneously at the jamboree, exactly when you feel like it – without needing to register in advance. Open activities therefore give you the freedom to choose exactly what you want to do at any given moment. Whether you are in the mood for high energy, creativity, reflection or something completely different, there will be activities that match exactly that.

Open activities give you freedom in your planning

Before you arrive, you can plan which open activities you would like to visit. For example, if you have a pre-booked activity at Activity Centre West or in Roskilde, you can make a plan for which nearby open activities you would like to visit when you are already heading to that activity area. You can also simply wander around the sections and see what inspires you in the moment.

Please note that open activities may also be marked 'Be on time' in the activity catalogue, which means you must be there when the activity begins in order to take part.

There are open activities at Activity Centre East and in Roskilde, with the largest number of open activities gathered at Activity Centre West.

We recommend setting aside a full day for a trip to Activity Centre West. There are so many great activities here that everyone is sure to fill the whole day with fun and rewarding experiences.

In the activity catalogue, you can filter by 'open activities' and 'At the jamboree' to see all the many open activities waiting to tempt you.

Kropt's Record Arena, FutureTown – the hunt through Baden-Powell's cryptic puzzles and riddles – escape runs, singing and body percussion with the Ecoband, Find Democracy and the Science Pirates' drop-in science tent.

- This is just a very small selection of the many different open activities you can discover.

When you get hungry, at Activity Centre West we have set up an entire section where you can eat your packed lunches or visit food trucks, ice cream kiosks and cafés.

Events by Age Groups

The Morning Party is primarily for guides and scouts under 12 years of age, and takes place every morning from Sunday to Friday at the Scout Stage by Activity Centre East. Here, the guides and scouts meet Rikke and Sille, who will warm up legs, arms, dance moves and singing voices together with all participants – with fun competitions, catchy songs and some truly special moments.

Do you want to be sure of starting the day well? Then bring your guides and scouts, your friendship group and your neighbouring group along to the Morning Party!

The children's event Flimmer Five-Challenge on Saturday morning will be a very special experience, aimed at all guides and scouts under 12 years of age. Here we will laugh together, compete with one another and really feel the sense of community. The Danish youtuber Lakserytteren will also be dropping by. There will be surprising elements, lots of laughter and exciting competitions! There will be dancing, singing and cosy togetherness with Rikke and Sille from the Morning Party.

Set the guides and scouts free at the Scout Stage for the children's event on Saturday morning and let them experience the community and scout spirit up close!

The MEGA-event will be a very special moment on Monday evening, primarily aimed at guides and scouts aged 12–18. This is where they show one another that the community among young guides and scouts is strong, bold and brilliant. It will be an event where the guides and scouts themselves set the tone, and where the energy comes directly from the participants.

The event will be packed with laughter, crazy moments and competitions. Along the way, there will be a shared moment for the entire jamboree, when everyone comes together for a big gathering. But the young people are at the forefront, setting the pace.

Fri-Rum (the Haven) is a break at Scenen (the Arena) on Tuesday evening for all leaders and volunteers aged 16 and over. It is for those who make sure there is food on the table in the group, that the guides and scouts get to bed on time, and those who keep the jamboree running as volunteers. In short, Fri-Rum is a haven for everyone who deserves a break: leaders, volunteers, group helpers, senior/clan guides and scouts and everyone in between.

Bring a blanket or sleeping mat, your best friend and a cup of coffee, and we will provide laughter, cosiness and a strong scouting and guiding community.

Camp Fires

The campfires are what tie the jamboree together in a beautiful bow. They mark the beginning and the end, when all the jamboree's participants meet, first to start the jamboree together and finally to say a proper goodbye to one another.

The opening campfire takes place on Sunday evening, when all guides and scouts have safely arrived at Hedeland. This is where the jamboree opens with a bang, as all participants gather in front of Scenen (the arena) and light the campfire.

We will of course sing the camp song and feel the thrill of being so many guides and scouts gathered in one place.

The jamboree's theme 'connect and include' is the focal point of the campfire, so link arms with your fellow guides and scouts and look forward to a cosy evening together with 30,000 other guides and scouts from near and far.

We are REALLY looking forward to seeing you all for a spectacular opening!

The closing campfire will be held on Saturday evening, when the jamboree is drawing to a close. This is where we say see you soon to all our new and old guide and scout friends.

We start already in the afternoon with a huge picnic on the grass, where all the jamboree's participants are welcome to eat together.

During the campfire, we look back on all the golden moments from the jamboree – the fun, the wild and the moving experiences.

With the theme 'connect and include', we will create an evening in the true spirit of community. The aim is to recreate the atmosphere from the smallest patrol hikes, group camps, centre summer jamborees and the like, when you meet around the campfire in the evening, share funny anecdotes and performances and sing favourite guiding and scouting songs together. So there will not be a big concert as in previous years, but we will still finish with a big finale.

We say a fond farewell, and see you again at Jamboree Denmark 2030!

The Future of Scouting and Guiding

On the outskirts of Hedeland, in beautiful surroundings, lies one of the first 'Future Scout Huts', donated by the A.P. Moller and Chastine Mc-Kinney Moller Foundation to Jamboree Denmark 2026 and Hedeland. Here, guides and scouts can experience the Guiding and Scouting of the future and find inspiration about the past, present and future through a wealth of exciting activities filled with fun, reflection, workshops and good conversations.

By working with the past, present and future, the guides and scouts gain an understanding of how today's Guiding and Scouting has been shaped by previous generations, and that they themselves are active co-creators of the Guiding and Scouting of the future.

On a journey through time, the guides and scouts are first taken back to the beginning of the Scouting movement, where they explore the values it is built on and the ideas behind the Scouting method. With society in that period in mind, the guides and scouts are challenged to explore how themes such as wellbeing, community, gender, responsibility and nature were understood.

The guides and scouts are then brought back to the present day, where, through practical exercises, they consider how we now work on the basis of the past,

while recognising that much has also changed. This helps them become aware of what they are already capable of and what they are good at.

Before setting off into the future, a keynote speaker (who changes from day to day) will encourage everyone to reflect on what society might look like in the years ahead. This forms the basis for the final part of the activity, where the guides and scouts work with their visions of future societal challenges and explore how the Guide and Scout Movement can be part of the solution.

The guides and scouts will define the first steps towards the future they imagine, based on concrete actions. The guides and scouts will also have the opportunity to work with their own hopes for the future, which will be anchored physically in the area through a "time capsule" and other visible marks. These will both give the place its own identity and serve as a lasting memory for the participants. A memory that should remind participants of the role they play in creating change.

Taken together, the activity strengthens the guides and scouts' belief in their own significance, their ability to take action and their sense of belonging to the Guide and Scout Movement – both now and in the future.

Camp Life

As part of the theme for Jamboree Denmark 2026 – “connect and include” – Camp Life is a central concept this year.

Do you know the feeling when there are still a few hours until the campfire meal is ready, and you are not quite sure how to pass the time? Or when you know the rules for the coolest game, but have no one to play it with? Then we have the answer!

In each subcamp you can visit **the Base**. Here you can come as a team or with new guide and scout friends to relax, play games and get creative. The Base can also be used for special events during the jamboree or as a meeting point for those who would like to meet new guides and scouts.

Around the subcamps you will also come across Camp Life in the form of **Life**. Here you will find games, decorations and other entertainment that fit each subcamp's theme.

All these facilities are free to use and will be marked with our logo, which can be seen below.

At Spejdertorvet (the jamboree main square) we are building an entrance to the VIP tent, which will be decorated with scarves. You can contribute a scarf from your group to make the entrance as unique as possible and showcase the guide and scout community at Denmark's largest jamboree!



Camp Hospital

When many of us are gathered at a jamboree, there is a risk of injury or illness. The jamboree's emergency services, first aid clinics and camp hospital have qualified, authorised healthcare professionals ready to help throughout the jamboree.

First Aid on the Campsite

Most minor injuries should be dealt with on the campsite, and each group is expected to bring suitable first aid equipment.

A first aid kit for treating minor cuts and injuries may usefully contain the following:

1. Tap water in a container or bottle, if there is no access to running water.
2. Soap
3. Kitchen roll for washing and drying
4. Regular plasters (preferably in several sizes)
5. Blister plasters
6. Tweezers

Contacting the Camp Hospital

In the event of more serious injuries or signs of illness, you can contact the camp hospital. Consultations with the camp hospital, first aid clinics and emergency services are free of charge for all jamboree participants, regardless of nationality.

However, the following requirements must be met when you attend:

- Everyone under the age of 15 **MUST** be accompanied by an adult when visiting a first aid clinic or the camp hospital. An adult is defined as someone older than 18 years of age who is responsible for the child and thus acts in place of the parents. In addition, please bring the telephone number of at least one parent who can be contacted.
- For Danish participants, everyone must bring or be able to recall their CPR number and full name.
- For international participants, everyone must bring a passport (or a copy thereof). If you have one, you must bring the blue European Health Insurance Card. If not, bring proof of insurance that covers illness or injury.
- If contact with the public hospital system becomes necessary, payment must be made in cash unless passport and insurance are in order. International participants must also bring proof of vaccination status against tetanus.

Hygiene, Medicine, Emergency numbers

Hygiene

Avoid stomach bugs (diarrhoea and/or vomiting) through prevention. It is important to wash your hands thoroughly with soap and running water and to use hand sanitiser afterwards before handling food.

Every visit to the toilet must end with a thorough handwash at a washbasin, using running water and soap. This can be supplemented with hand sanitiser. Hand sanitiser is not an alternative to using a washbasin – only a supplement. Avoid touching your mobile phone when visiting the toilet, as this contributes significantly to the spread of bacteria.

Medicine

Regular medicine, dressings, care products, etc. must be brought from home.

As a general rule, medicine should be stored within your own camp area at the jamboree. However, it will be possible to store medicine that must be kept refrigerated, provided this was noted upon registration. In each subcamp's information tent there will be a locked refrigerator for storing these types of medicine. Upon arrival at the jamboree, the medicine must be placed in the refrigerator in the info tent. The name and group name must be clearly visible on the medicine. It is possible to take your medicine in a screened room during the info tent's opening hours.

Any other arrangements for distribution are agreed locally in each individual information tent.

A pharmacy outlet with limited opening hours will be established at Spejdertorvet. Here you can buy over-the-counter products and plasters, as well as collect prescriptions.

Important phone numbers during the jamboree

The jamboree has its own control centre, which you can contact if help is needed (ambulance, fire and rescue, faults in technical installations such as toilets, etc.).

The emergency number is used in situations where you would normally call the regular emergency services (in Denmark you call 112).

Non-emergency calls should be made to the operations centre. For example, it may concern tradesperson assistance, reporting faults in installations, contacting a jamboree attendant, etc.

Used for any questions that arise during the jamboree. The phone line is open from 6:30 AM to 10.30 PM.

nature in Hedeland

In Hedeland Naturpark, you will find both wet bog and meadow areas, and small ponds, lakes and large expanses of dry grassland. Hedeland Naturpark is a large continuous natural area that gives species good opportunities to reproduce and spread. Large parts of Hedeland Naturpark are protected, and we must therefore have a community ensure that we impact it as little as possible.

In connection with Jamboree Denmark 2026, some areas are fenced off to protect particular species. There will be an information at the enclosures explaining the habitat types and species.

Clear-water Lakes – No bathing or swimming allowed

The lakes in Hedeland Naturpark have nice, clear waters. A lot of them are directly connected to the groundwater. They are very low in nutrients, and therefore do not produce the same algae blooms as seen in many other lakes around the country. The nature park's lakes are vulnerable to disturbance, and therefore we are not allowed to bath or swim in the lakes.

Butterfly Area

The area north-west in subcamp Skoven (the Forest), near Boomerangskoven, is a breeding ground for an endangered butterfly species called "Isblåfugl" (Amanda's blue, *Polyommatus amandus*). When Jamboree Denmark 2026 takes place, the butterflies will have laid their eggs on the blades of grass in the area. It is therefore important that we stay out of the area so we do not trample the eggs and make the species even more endangered.



nature in Hedeland

Wild Parsnip

All around Hedeland Naturpark you can come across the plant wild parsnip. And even though the plant looks exciting, you should avoid contact with it.

The plant is in the hogweed family and contains a toxin. The toxin reacts when exposed to sunlight, and if it gets on the skin, there is a risk of blisters and wounds that resemble burns.

Wild parsnip is recognised by its umbels of small yellow flowers that bloom in June/July. It grows along roadsides and in open grasslands. Wild parsnip is very distinctive and difficult to confuse with other plants. It has yellow-green flowers and yellow-green leaves. Most other wild umbel plants in Danish nature have white flowers. In July it grows approximately 75 cm tall, including the flower head.

If you get the juice on your skin, wash the area thoroughly and keep the skin covered and protected from the sun for at least 48 hours. If you develop symptoms, you can contact the Emergency clinics or the camp hospital.

Archaeology in Hedeland

Protected Burial Mounds

In Hedeland Naturpark, there are several burial mounds. They are located in the easternmost part of the nature park and have lain like pearls on a string since ancient times, probably along an ancient road.

Jamboree Denmark 2026 takes place around two of the burial mounds: Bavnehøj and Præstehøj. All burial mounds are protected, and the area around them is also protected, as many relics from the past may be hidden there. To take care of both the burial mounds and the plants and animals that live on them, it will not be possible to go up onto the two burial mounds. At Bavnehøj, which is located in subcamp Havet (the sea), we must keep a distance of 20 metres from the burial mound. Within 100 metres of the burial mound, there are special rules on how we are allowed to dig fire pits and holes for flags and poles.

Affected groups are informed directly by the subcamps.

Protected Dykes

The dykes that run through subcamp Byen (the City) and subcamp Landet (the Countryside) are historical markers of where the old borders in the landscape were. Despite their sometimes small height, they have great historical value and can also store seeds from the trees and plants that were in the area many hundreds of years ago. In order to preserve the dykes, crossings will be created that allow us to take good care of the historical remains in the area. It is therefore only permitted to cross the dykes via the crossings.

Possibility of Archaeological Finds

Particularly in the fields of subcamp Byen (the City) and subcamp subcamp Landet (the Countryside), a number of archaeological treasures have previously been found. If a guide or scout, for example while digging a pole hole, comes across any metal they believe has historical value, it is important that the leader notes where and at what depth it was found, and then hands in the find at the Information Tent on the subcamp square.

The local museum only wishes to receive metal. That means that stones, flint, pottery shards and charcoal do not need to be handed in at the Information Tent if you find them.

Garbage and Recycling

The Jamboree's Recycling Contractor

The Jamboree Denmark 2026 recycling team has chosen Remondis as the jamboree's recycling contractor. Remondis was also the recycling contractor at Jamboree Denmark in 2022, which means that, in collaboration with them, we can build on the experience from the last jamboree.

Together with Remondis, we will make it easy to return and sort your recycling and garbage, so that we can create more sustainable recycling and garbage management at the jamboree.

Sorting Categories

All campsites must sort garbage into eight different categories, as it is also done in the rest of Denmark. These categories follow the national categories.

The eight categories are:

- Food garbage
- Glass
- Paper and cardboard
- Plastic, food and beverage cartons
- Metal
- Textile garbage
- Hazardous waste
- Residual waste

At the jamboree, a sorting guide will be included in the arrival materials. If your guides and scouts are not used to sorting garbage when you are at a jamboree, it may be a good idea to introduce them to the categories before the jamboree.

We are currently working on a sorting solution for campsites, which you can purchase for your group if you need a good garbage sorting system for your jamboree. If your group already has a system that works well for you, you are of course welcome to bring this with you.

Garbage Disposal Sites and Opening Hours

Each subcamp square will have a sorting point where groups must return their garbage. Towards the end of the jamboree, this is also where you can return larger items of garbage.

Each garbage disposal site will be open during meal periods, so you can return your garbage at the same time as you collect your food.

Clear garbage bags will be available at the food distribution point.

Layout of the Group's Campsites

The groups' campsites are their "homes" at Jamboree Denmark 2026. Campsites can be arranged in many different ways, depending on the size of the groups, the age sections, history, traditions and overall ideas. At the same time, much of the layout will be reused from jamboree to jamboree, for example tents, campfire sites and wooden pole structures.

We work with standardised rules for how groups can structure a campsite. The jamboree does not wish to limit groups in their opportunities to put their own mark on their campsite, but instead wants the groups to understand what Jamboree Denmark 2026 and the authorities expect of the campsite layout.

Rules for setting up tents

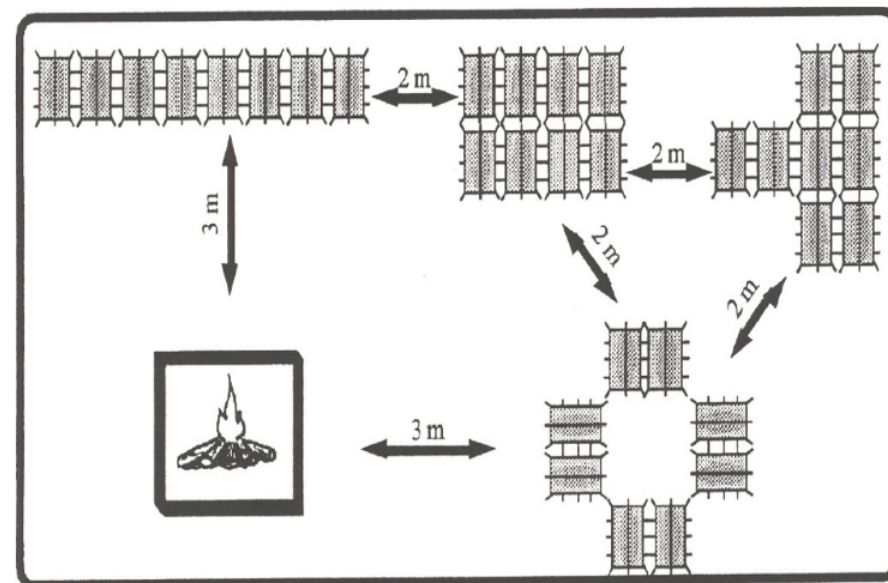
Tents for overnight stays may be set up in clusters. A maximum of eight tents in each cluster. Between tent clusters there must be at least two metres from guy line to guy line.

If teepee/laavu-style tents are set up in a cluster, the distance to the surrounding clusters must be great enough that no part of the tents can hit the surrounding clusters if the teepee/laavu structure topples. However, the distance must always be at least two metres from guy line to guy line.

Rules for campfire sites

There must be at least three metres between tents and campfire sites, including elevated firepits and other campfire set-ups/gas burners. The distance must be measured from the edge of the fire pit (the inside of any edge protection of, for example wood or stone) to the nearest part of the tent (guy line, tent fabric or pole).

Traffic Information

When 30,000 guides and scouts gather, the roads around Hedeland Naturpark will come under pressure. The jamboree aims to cause as little inconvenience as possible to our neighbours and other road users. We therefore encourage everyone to be considerate and respectful of the local area.

Arrival and Departure in Your Own Bus

If you do not wish to use the jamboree's shared transport and instead travel in your own bus, you must drive to Brandhøjgårdsvej 21, 2640 Hedehusene. On the two main arrival and departure days, we use the entire length of Brandhøjgårdsvej for drop-off and pick-up. All buses are directed onto Brandhøjgårdsvej from the north via Hovedgaden, as the road is one-way for bus transport during the jamboree period. Bus drivers must follow the instructions given by the jamboree's traffic wardens, and it is strictly forbidden to drop off or pick up passengers anywhere other than at the designated locations.

City Buses

City buses will run every 30–60 minutes between the jamboree and Roskilde and Høje-Taastrup train station. At the jamboree the bus stop is located on Tranemosevej close to Reerslev Church. The buses run in the period 19th-25th of July. The specific departure times will be available on <https://rejseplanen.dk> and on our website when they are ready.

Parking Permits

The groups receives parking permits when checking in. Each group receives one parking permit per 50 participants, which gives free access to the parking area. If additional parking is required, a fee of DKK 250 is charged for the entire jamboree. Payment is made upon entry to the parking area. Parking trailers etc. is free in the long-term parking area.

Lost and Found

Experience from earlier jamborees has shown us that things are often lost on a jamboree. It can be anything from a short length of rope to an entire, fully packed rucksack. Lost and found items can be handed in and collected at all information tents in the four subcamps and at Spejdertorvet (the jamboree main square). We hope that all lost and found items will be reunited with their rightful owners. We will take all found items and reported losses seriously, and we will work with clear focus to ensure that each lost item and its owner are brought back together.

You can help us by ensuring that all participants label their belongings with their own name, group name and phone number.

All lost and found items are handled according to the guidelines of the Danish police, i.e. a distinction is made between items worth more than or less than DKK 500. All lost and found items handed in at an information tent will be registered in a database, so they can easily be located when the owner comes forward.

When the jamboree ends, all unclaimed lost and found items are collected. Items with a value of more than 500 DKK are handed over to the police in Roskilde immediately after the jamboree. All other items are donated to charitable causes. Jamboree Denmark 2026 does not forward lost and found items after the jamboree.

Help the Jamboree's Photographers

Unique arrivals and fun ways of travelling

If you arrive at Jamboree Denmark 2026 in a soapbox car, a horse-drawn carriage or in another fun and unusual way, make sure to let the photographers know. It is moments like these that can turn into amazing photos and great memories from the jamboree.

Wild and unusual activities

If your group has something wild and different planned, such as building an unusual pioneering project, or if your group leader plans to spend the whole day walking on their hands, it is worth letting the photographers know. The same applies if you are trying to break a world record in pyjama dancing or have other creative ideas.

How to help the photographers

For the photographers to capture the best moments, it is important that you tell them when something special is happening. That way, they can be ready with their cameras and make sure they get the best shots.

Drone flying

For the safety of jamboree participants, partners, visitors and local residents, and due to the proximity to Roskilde Airport, no drone flying of any kind is permitted. The entire jamboree site will be monitored with drone-detection equipment, and unauthorised drone flying will be reported to the police at the jamboree.

Permission for drone flying has been granted to the jamboree's few accredited professional drone photographers.
